For several years the church has considered buying a van. The big questions have always been, what would we use it for, and who would be in charge of it? Because we've never had really good, clear answers for those guestions, we've held off moving ahead with a van. Well, the answer to the first question has finally come about. We have been working with the YMCA this year and transporting kids from the Y to the church for Wednesday Night Live, Kids Club and Col-

Live, Kids Club and Collide. This has become such a need that multiple transporters have been needed, and people are using their personal vehicles to get kids to the church, and then home to New Boston and the west end of the county. The Trustees were asked to look into a van and make a recommendation during the January business meeting. In a special business meeting in March the Trustees proposed a 15 pas-

senger bus that had luggage space in the back, which would be a good feature for trips such as men's and women's retreats, camp, etc... The cost would be about \$50,000. The church would simply need to figure out way to pay for it, which was given to the Finance board. By God's grace and timing, the church was given some stock at the end of 2015 which will be sold in the amount of about \$40,000. The remainder of the cost of the van would be split between current expense and building fund. The van should be here and available to use around the end of May. The main use of the van is to go out into the highways and byways and pick up young people to bring them to church, and our prayer is ultimately to bring them to the Lord. It will also be used to

transport our people out into the world for missions, conferences and camps. It will be a great tool for the Lord to use at First Baptist to continue His work, and I'm excited for the possibilities we haven't even thought of yet. The second question has also been answered. Three different guys have said they would be willing to maintain the van. Everything we do requires many people to make sure it happens and happens well. I am encouraged that people are stepping up to the plate and volunteering. If you want to get involved, there is a place for you to serve, just let us know and we will find a place for you to get involved.

Save the dates—July Sunday Night Remix!



There are so many students who are in a tremendous amount of pain. I know that God is with them. I'm so thankful the youth ministry has become a safe haven for them and a place where they can come and learn about the God who loves them with a fierce, everlasting love.

Then there are other stories like this one from a young 6th grade girl who said, "before, I went to Fall Retreat this fall I was completely lost, we called ourselves Christians, but we knew nothing about what it meant to be a Christian. I used to go to church sometimes with my grandma, but honestly, I just went for the candy. Fall retreat, completely flip flopped my life, because I learned what Jesus Christ was and I learned about Collide and I started coming more and more and started learning more about Jesus. Then, my whole family started coming to church. Now, we pray together as a family and our lives are completely different."

That right there is at the heart of what we do, ministering to see a family completely transformed by Jesus and God used a 12 year-old girl to do it. He got a hold of her heart and has now captured the hearts of that whole family.

I must say this was by far, one of my favorite years during youth ministry. The team of people I served with were tremendous, the atmosphere in youth group was fun, engaging and gospel-centered. I walked away this year with great joy knowing that God moved in our midst and He continues to bless the youth ministry as we seek to honor Him in all that we do.

May News-Kids Club Ministry



Last weekend I laid down and totally let Satan beat me up. It all started with a dream I had about an old friend from 6th grade. When I woke up, I thought about a mistake I made that I hadn't thought about in a long time. I said something out of anger and it ended up hurting her deeply. Even though I didn't mean it, apologized several times, and tried to make it up to her, our friendship was never the same after that. Even though that was 26 years ago, and I had already asked forgiveness from her and from God many times over, I was reliving it in my mind and feeling bad all over again. Then it was one bad thought after another. A line-up of sinful, selfish, careless, hurtful, and negligent things I've said or done over my lifetime that snuck into my thoughts at random. By the time Sunday night rolled around I felt thoroughly beat up. Then I snapped out of it! I was under spiritual attack and instead of putting on my spiritual armor and filling up with God's truth, I just let it keep happening over and over again.

There I was, a child of the risen king, lying down and letting Satan beat me up with negative thoughts. Take a look at what **Romans 8:31-39** says, ^{31...} If God is for us, who can be against us? ³² He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? ³³ Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? ³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, ³⁹ neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Even though I should have called Satan out way before I did, it reminded me of a few things. 1) I am God's and He loves me. Just like how nothing would ever change the love I have for my kids, God feels that for me but a billion times more intensely. 2) When I start to feel sucked into negative feelings about myself, especially ones that lead to guilt and self-loathing, I need to take those thoughts captive and give them to the Lord right away. Those thoughts are from the enemy and I have no use for them. 3) The more I talk to God and fill-up with his truth, the less I have those thoughts, anxieties, and worthless obsessions. I need God every day and when I neglect him, I let my guard down and Satan attacks. Here are a few more passages to look up if this hits home to you: Isaiah 26:3, 2 Corinthians 10:3-6 and Romans 12:2. Need a little extra encouragement right now, reach out to a Christian brother or sister. Tell them you're struggling and ask them to pray for you. Satan wants you wallow in and cover up your struggles. Bring them into the light and allow others to help encourage you. Thanks for reading and have a great month! Mollie
