“We take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.” 2 Corinthians 10:5b

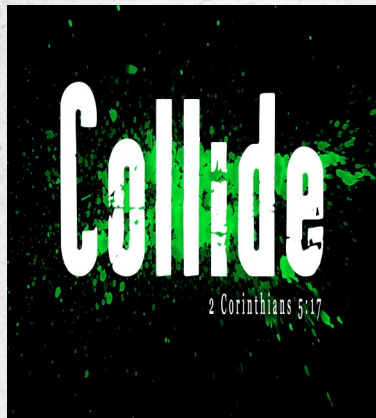
Taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ isn't just a quaint Biblical saying, or pretty piece of poetry. It's extremely hard work. Not only do we have to contend with our own wrong thoughts about virtually everything, but we have the constant pressure of our world around us which insists that we compromise. And if that weren't enough, we may even have well-meaning Christians playing devil's advocate. Over the course of my Christian life thinking Biblically has become more and more important to me. As the world around us rushes away from Biblical ideas not merely in regards to morals, but in all ways imaginable, thinking Biblically is more essential than ever. Thinking Biblically gives us a firm foundation when life's circumstances and sinful temptations create chaos around us. It helps us stay in tune with God and becomes a compass and a lighthouse for our lives to keep us from shipwrecking our faith. That is why I have decided to preach through the

entire Bible over the next two years. I will take each book of the Bible and focus on one key verse or passage, so as to preach 66 sermons from the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments. My hope is to equip our church to know and understand all of God's Word so we can take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ. Every plan and purpose we may have as a church should be founded on this one crucial element. When we humbly seek God's truth in all matters, and consciously resolve to obey whatever He reveals His will to be, nothing on earth has the power to stop us. Jesus said the gates of hell wouldn't prevail against His church. What's so important about that statement is that gates are defensive, not offensive. What that means is that the church is the offensive actor, and our activity is to rescue as many people as possible from the danger of eternal separation from God. And Lord willing, we will do so. I'm excited for a new year of ministry, and the great things God has in store for our church.

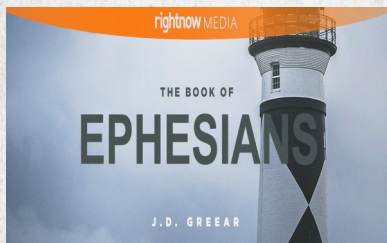

# Annual Meeting/Changes to Rules & Constitution



## Annual Business Meeting First Baptist Church Sunday, January 21st Following the 10:15am Service

The First Baptist Church Annual Meeting will be **Sunday, Jan. 21st** following the 10:15am service. **\*\*Please have your yearly committee and quarterly reports to the church office by Thursday, January 4th. The Church Council meets on Tuesday, Jan. 16th at 7pm.**

**Contribution & Constitutional Changes** –The Church Council has made changes to the Standing Rules regarding Contributions and Designated Giving at FBC. There is also a proposed change to the Constitution which we will vote on during the Annual Business Meeting on Jan. 21st. See the changes below.

## Constitutional Changes – Draft 10/24/2017

Section VI.5 Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer

Remove: Reference to elected position

Add: Presenting Financial reports to council

A Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall be members in good standing and be elected at the annual election of lay officers for a term of three years. The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer may be elected to consecutive terms. The Treasurer shall hold and disburse all money contributed for current expenses, missions and benevolent purposes of the Church, and keep itemized account of such disbursements. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report of receipts and disbursements showing the actual financial conditions of the Church to the Church Council for approval and presentation to the church at business meetings. He or she shall present all financial records to be audited when requested by the audit committee or other authorized auditing authority. The Assistant Treasurer shall work closely with the Treasurer and perform all duties of the Treasurer when required. The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall cooperate with and provide assistance as requested by any authorized auditing committee but shall not be a member of such committee. The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer may be dismissed from office for dereliction of duty.

Service VI.6 Financial Secretary and Assistant Financial Secretary

Remove: restriction concerning consecutive terms

...may be elected for consecutive terms.

## Standing Rules Changes – Draft – 10/24/17

New Article: Article VIII Contributions and Designated Giving

- a. Categories for Designated Giving shall be determined by the Finance Board with assistance of the Treasurer and submitted to the Church Council for approval.
- b. Designations for Giving shall become part of the Church Budget.
- c. Financial Gifts specifically designated which do not meet with approved categories shall be returned to the gifter.
- d. Memorial Gifts shall be accepted and held/and or distributed according to the approved designations. Memorial Gifts received with special designation which do not fall within the parameters of the approved Designations shall be returned to the gifter.
- e. Nothing in this Article shall impede or restrict the Church Council from amending Designation categories for the purpose of conducting church business within the calendar year. Such changes affecting the budget shall be reported to the Church body at the next regularly scheduled business meeting.

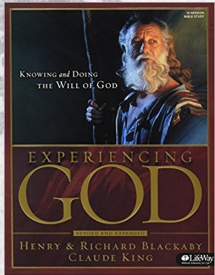
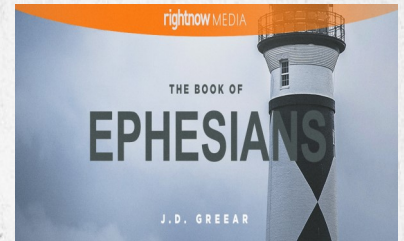

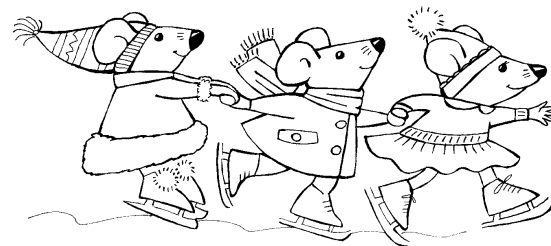

# A Word From Pastor Seth

Job 2: 11b-13—They made an appointment together to come to show him sympathy and comfort him. <sup>12</sup> And when they saw him from a distance, they did not recognize him. And they raised their voices and wept, and they tore their robes and sprinkled dust on their heads toward heaven. <sup>13</sup> And they sat with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his suffering was very great.



In understanding the story of Job and knowing that Job's friends started with the right heart and attitude for Job. Chapter two shows a picture of this friends who had sympathy and comfort to share with Job. They came in and suffered with him. Later the wheels fell off and when they opened their mouth and tried to give advice. Reading through grief materials I came across the following advice:

Frequently family members and friends wonder what they can do for the patient who is too weak to leave the bed. The best thing we can do for anyone is to be present. Presence is being available to the other person physically and emotionally. One can be present holding a hand at the bedside or sitting in a chair across the room. When their emotional pain is intense, your presence, not words, may bring the most comfort. Rarely do people remember spoken words. They remember your presence—simply you being there.

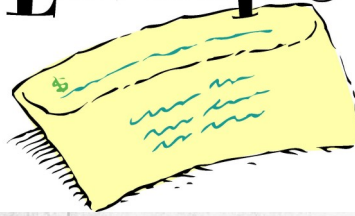
This is just what Job's friends did, they became available, for Job to decide when to talk about the pain or even to speak. Compassion simply means to come and suffer with. God is the Father of all Compassion and He came into this world and suffered in every point we suffer yet without sin. Allow the Lord to produce this authentic compassion for those around you. ~Seth
