

A while back Luke and I were committed viewers of the weight loss TV show, Biggest Loser. It's a show where folks who are obese are given the opportunity to get healthy. Throughout the season they compete against each other to lose the most weight. I remember watching the introduction footage of each contestant, seeing their unhealthy eating habits and destructive life patterns. They knew they were unhealthy, they loathed the state at which drove them to sign up for the show, and consistently across the board they were extremely unhappy because their physical state kept them from living their life abundantly. It always baffled me to see that they seemed to continue those choices all the way up to the first day of the show, instead of making gradual changes until the show began. It wasn't until they were completely immersed in the show and had an entourage

of people to help them and hold them accountable, that they were able to start gaining victory in their lives over their health.

This is how it can be in our spiritual lives too. Surrendering our lives to Jesus is a daily task and it's not easy. If we don't remain diligent in walking toward the Lord, we can easily wander off course and enter into a state of spiritual numbness. I haven't met a Christian who doesn't spend some time feeling numb in their faith walk every once in a while. We're human, we get tired and worn down, we get disappointed or jaded, and it happens. While we can look at shows like The Biggest Loser and wonder how in the world they let themselves get to that extent, we do the same thing in our faith walk.



As believers we know that Jesus is our only HOPE for change, but we have to do the work! God loves us so much and has blessed us with tools to grow close to him. These tools include having a relationship with him through prayer and study, direction through

his Word and encouragement and accountability in Christian fellowship. Our faith walk wasn't meant to be taken alone. We need God's help and we need each other. I bet if you ask anybody who feels spiritually numb, at least one of these tools aren't being used. We're all guilty of this sometimes.

The Life Action Revival is going on here at FBC until Sunday, April 5th. If you haven't made it a point to come out and see what God has in store for you I strongly encourage you to join us no matter where you are in your faith walk. Ephesians 6:10-18 - ¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, ¹⁸ praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, ¹⁹ and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel,²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.




