
Much like physical thirst, which not quenched once. but must be quenched continually, our thirst for God is not quenched by a one-time act

Somehow or other we seem to drift toward a sense of self-satisfaction, which leads to selfishness, which turns to grumbling, entitlement, anger, and a host of other sins. The Thirst Revival was a great reminder to come back to God and find contentment in Him. Some were convicted to ask forgiveness from people they had hurt, others needed to forgive those who had hurt All in all, peace with God through repentance and obedience is a priceless gift that is nearly impossible to describe. Our desire is to preach, teach and live out the authentic Christian life at First Baptist every single day, knowing how easily and how quickly we get thirsty for God. By God's grace we will be a place where rivers of living water flows.

Last month, I watched this movie called "The Christmas Candle" where the new pastor moved to a village

church where the villagers believed in the miraculous power of a legendary Christmas candle. The tradition of this candle provided a Christmas miracle to a chosen family with a special need or problem, providing hope for the people in the village as Christmas came around. They would leave their requests at the candle shop to



hopefully be chosen as the fortunate benefactor of the candle.

The church folk didn't like the new reverend's thoughts about this candle because he saw how they put too much of their hope in this candle rather than in the hope of Jesus. He said something like this: All around you are people in need who need a miracle. Instead of waiting for the candle to fulfil a need, why don't you be that miracle? And then he proceeded to lead by example. In one scene, he asked an older lady what her need was and she said a knitting partner. In the next scene, a neighbor lady was coming to visit an older lady and when the older lady opened the door, the good reverend was sitting on the couch in the background with knitting needles in hand. He was her miracle.

This advent season we have an opportunity to be the miracle to those around us and it doesn't necessarily



have to have anything to do with money. It's usually an act of service or time that may be inconvenient, sacrificial, and fairly simple in nature. Being somebody's miracle is usually meeting a need they have through an act

of service or kindness. Philippians 2:4 says, "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interest of others." Let's take the time this month to look for ways we can bless one another in simple ways. Let's provide a listening ear without rushing away, send a kind note to someone who is struggling, offer to babysit for a tired mom, wash the dishes for our spouse after a long day, stay behind after a gathering and help clean up, or visit that person you know is lonely. Let's be the miracle for others and enjoy this season of hope in Jesus! Merry Christmas! ~ Mollie

Deacon Fund, that would be greatly appreciated. Just put "Deacon Fund" in the memo of your check or in the comment section of your online giving.




Adult Classes

The Gospel Project—The Church on Mission-A study of the book of Acts-Taught By Kevin Ricke at their home 1100 S. College Ave., Aledo-Class is Free to Attend— features 13 Bible study sessions and easy-to-follow talking points for group time with an emphasis to respond in mission. This session's study is *The Church on Mission*, covering *The Spirit Who Empowers* (Acts) and *The God Who Sends* (Acts).




