As we look at expanding most of our ministries and staff, it becomes clear that giving will have to increase to make sure we can do everything we feel God leading us to do. I don't know what people give, which is a good thing, so I can't say I know exactly where the encouragement or teaching needs to be. I will say from a personal perspective on giving, that Mollie and I have always felt a conviction to tithe (give 10% of our income) to the church, and from time to time I have felt God's leading to be generous beyond tithing, by giving an offering to special needs. I am very grateful that we have a church family that not only supports the ministry we've been called to do here in Mercer County, but is also generous to support mission work all over the United States and the world. Not only that but we have been blessed this year to buy a church bus, which is getting used at least twice a week to transport kids and youth from the west side of the county to the church, and many, many volunteers who make it all happen. So, let me leave you with three things ...

Collide Youth Ministry

"Ever since my daughter started going to Collide about a year ago, she's become a different person. She has joy, happiness and peace in her life. Whatever she has, I want that in my life too," said a mom to while we were having lunch together.

I had never met this mom before, but God has been challenging me to start meeting with the parents of our un-churched kids, with the hopes of building relationships and ultimately, teaching them about Christ too. I could tell as soon as this mom sat down, she was hungry, not just for lunch, but hungry for something more in her life. She had walked a difficult road in life and no matter what or who she looked to she never found satisfaction, so I told her about the only hope that truly lasts. I shared with her the hope her daughter has embraced through Christ and the love and forgiveness offered to her through Him!

I challenged her to respond to the gospel message, laying down her life and her sin to embrace God's love and forgiveness for her. She told me she would definitely have a conversation with God about all of this once she got home. I said, Ok, but you let me know when and if you make the decision to follow Jesus. Well, I got this text message from her once she got home.

"I have to share this with you. I was on my way home and was talking to God about letting o and letting God take control and a semi was barreling in from a side road and missed the stop sign and yet somehow managed to stop just shy of hitting me and I honestly don't feel like it was a coincidence! I felt like God saved me! I know it sounds crazy, but it's true! I've never been a firm believer in miracles, but I wasn't scared. I felt like it was going to be ok?!" Then I responded by asking her if she had put her trust in Jesus, so that if she had died, she would go and be with God. I reminded her this was God sending her a message that we never know when our life on earth will end. She said, "I did not, but I certainly am now." I encouraged her to get on her knees and cry out to God! She did! And she said, "I feel relieved that's the best way I can think of describing it. Relieved, like a pound of bricks has been lifted off my shoulders." I told her that was the weight of sin being taken from her! She was now free! She came to church this past Sunday and I couldn't be more excited for this mom and daughter as they continue their faith journeys together, following Jesus. Another mom who I invited over for dinner just recently told me something similar, "Heather, my daughter has changed." Friends, this is the power of God working in our teens, continue to pray for them.

Also, please celebrate with me all the work God did at fall retreat. There were 15 students who gave their lives to Christ. I'll share that story next month, because I'm out of room! Kids Club Ministry

I've been increasingly unsettled about some of the moral dilemmas our culture and governing leaders are pushing into the "norm" of our society. This made me think about the old hymn that was written in the civil war era, "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus." This song is based on a devoted preacher who lived in the south but disagreed with slavery. The result was that they kicked him out of the church for taking a stand against something that he was convicted about. He went on to influence many and bring many to faith in Jesus because he dared to stand up for Jesus even in adversity.

Convictions are a funny thing. God leads us differently than others sometimes and it can be a lonely or painful road to travel. While it may be tempting to make excuses because God isn't leading others the same as you, if God is leading you, it's in your best interest to obey Him because he is God and he knows best. Psalm 128:1 says, "Blessed are all who fear the LORD, who walk in obedience to him."

When these convictions pop up in our lives, which they will if you're following God, we have a choice to make. Ignore them and make excuses, or obey the Spirit's prompting and grow. When we disobey, it holds us back from spiritual growth. John 14:15 says, "If you love me obey my commandments." When we obey, it catapults us toward God and we are blessed by that obedience.

It is so hard to stand up for Jesus right now. We have so many pressures and worldly agendas circling around us at all times. While we want to follow Jesus with our hearts, our flesh is constantly battling against us. The temptation to cling to our pleasures and comforts is real! How do you know if you're being convicted? Well, a good sign is that you keep thinking about it and it won't go away. Sometimes God gives us insight into the prompting, but sometimes, He doesn't. Read God's Word. Talk to Him and talk these convictions out with those who love Him, too. Ask others to pray for you and keep you accountable. Keep following Him, even when it's hard, and be prepared to be blessed by God's faithfulness to you! I look forward to seeing the fruitfulness of obedience to God in the lives of our congregation in the months to come.

A Word From Pastor Seth

Thankful, Grateful Appreciative

With the harvest bushels coming in we will quickly slip into the Thanksgiving celebration. Thanksgiving is a time to count our blessings and thank God for everything. Learning to be grateful even during the hard times and through things we consider to be hard. We are in the process of learning that all things happen for the good of those who love God. Having an Appreciative heart through every moment during this life is the goal.

Last year on Thanksgiving day our church supported a free meal to the community. Our Scripture for them is from **Luke 14:12-14** "... When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just." Last year we served 31 meals at the senior center, 9 meals delivered to the emergency workers on duty, 27 meals were delivered to the door, and all this was done by 34 volunteers.

We have the following volunteer positions available this year: serving, food pick up and delivery, coat check, pie crew, greeters, bus driver, drink crew and clean-up crew.
