Pastor Luke's Perspective

One of the Scriptures that I have often reflected on is a little known verse in Acts. Acts 13:36 states that David served God's purpose in his own generation. The point



that the Apostle Paul was making was actually about Jesus. Basically, what Paul was referring to was that when David had served God's purpose he died, whereas Jesus rose from the dead in order to be faithful in and to all generations. In

other words, Jesus's faithfulness wasn't limited to one lifespan. But I often reflect on the fact that David was considered faithful in his own generation. David had a role to play, and he had a short time in which to do it. He only lived to be about 70. Obviously our greatest comfort is in the fact that Jesus is alive and well and will accomplish His plan in every generation. I also take encouragement that we each have a role to play in His plan in our generation. I don't have to worry about two or three generations down the road, or what God might want to do in 50 years. I have to simply seek to be faithful in God's plan for the unique and specific time and place He put me on this earth for. Faithfulness, obedience, and listening to God's voice is our greatest challenge and our most important assignment. I have been

overwhelmed by this church's willingness to follow God's will wherever that may lead. I believe that quality is our greatest strength. This year, I believe, holds great possibilities for our church. We have been a wonderfully fruitful church, and I have full faith and confidence that we will not only continue to be so, but even more so in the years ahead. That fruitfulness also produces challenges. We have had to add staff, trust God with a bigger budget, be creative with our spaces, and deal with the increasing need for volunteers, assimilation, discipleship, counseling, and a myriad of other things. I love it. It's exciting to see God move the way He's moving at FBC. And so, for the last year and a half the building committee has been working to figure out and prayerfully discern solutions for some of our challenges. I'm excited to announce that we are finally ready to unveil what has taken us so long to discern. We are planning to present the building committee's findings at the annual business meeting in January. We want to make sure that everyone can be there, so we are planning to hold the meeting at 6pm on January 22nd. I want to personally thank Steve Struble, Aaron Struble, Todd Coulter, Karen McConaughey, Kevin Ricke and Perry Baugher for your patient, wholehearted service on the building committee. So, please mark your calendars and spend the next few weeks praying for God to lead our church exactly where He wants it to go, and for our own courage to be faithful in our generation.


Lastly, in order to help students and families get the




Women's Genesis Study Tuesdays @ 1:30pm


