

God is certainly at work amongst our teenagers. If you weren't there, you really missed out on hearing some real, honest, transparent stories from our teenagers. They boldly shared their struggles. They opened up and paved the way for others to do the same. We were all challenged by the students to lay down the masks we hide behind at the altar. Many rose to the challenge along with the students to leave their fear, anger, resent-

ment, pride, selfishness, or whatever else they were hiding behind at the feet of Jesus. I have never seen such a response at the 8am service. I was overwhelmed as nearly 25 people laid down their masks at the altar in response to the students challenge that morning. A similar response was made at the 10am service. I watched as the students' eyes lit up, because in that moment, they realized God was using them to reach the church.



I know God will use these stories from our young people to stir our church to greater lengths of faith. My prayer is now that the students have paved the way with their transparency that we, as

adults, will come with the same broken and contrite hearts and admit to our own brokenness. Together, we can see lives transformed and healed.

As you can see, I'm excited for what God has in store. I am so proud of our youth who shared their stories with the church, who served, spoke, sang and truly became the church of TODAY, not just the church of tomorrow this past Sunday. Pray with me these students would embrace God's call on their life to be the church of today. Pray for them to stay connected, honest and transparent. In doing so, we'll see the church revived and God's kingdom come in greater ways.

This morning at prayer group a 7th grader said to me, "*Fall Retreat, made me become a Christian.*" I asked her what she meant by that, she said, a week after fall retreat, one night while reading her Bible she decided that she was going to make Jesus Lord and Savior of her life. 

15 members of FBC will be ministering to several churches in January. We





A Note from Pastor Seth

Justify myself!

Justify means to give reason, make something seem reasonable and free someone from sin.

I receive this lesson, on ongoing bases, in my Christian walk. I find myself always trying to reason or make my sin seem reasonable. Just recently God brought me to this lesson again. I recently was pulled over for speeding. I instantly wanted to justify myself but I knew I was guilty. I did not try to reason, I did not try to explain I simply said I was wrong and I broke the law. The kind hearted officer said he wanted to give me a warning but could not. I received a ticket.

Now how I share this story will be me trying to justify myself. I want to tell you what happened. I was passing a vehicle that was going about 40-50 mph depending on the uphill or down. I followed this vehicle for 6 miles waiting for a safe place to pass and when the safe place came I went for it and monster mashed the gas because there were two slow vehicles. I got the little car up to a great speed and the first car I met when back in my lane was a State Trooper. I am guilty and broke the law. No amount of reasoning will help I broke the law and deserve punishment.

This instantly makes me think of God's law. I try to reason with Him on His commands and I continually try to justify myself before Him. The law is the law and I am guilty of breaking the law. Are you like me? Are you trying to reason your way with God? Are you trying to justify yourself? We are all guilty and deserve death but God is rich in mercy.
