"Gentle Reminder"

Even though we plan things pretty far in advance, it seems they still sneak up on us. September is a busy month at First Baptist as we kick off all our Wednesday Night Live classes along with Kids Club, Collide, as well as our annual Praise in the Park. I hope, as you read this newsletter, that the things I just mentioned aren't news to you. If they are news to you, I hope you know it's not too late. You still have time to plan on joining First Baptist at Central Park in Aledo on Sunday September 4th at 10:15am for worship, followed by a meal and an afternoon of activities. And you still have time to sign up for a class, and you still have time to get your kids to Kids Club and Collide. But what I really want to talk about is the issue of time... People often say, "It's never too late", and "there's always next time." And while I don't relish being the bearer of bad news, sometimes it is too late, and sometimes there is no next time. For instance, next year will mark the 150th anniversary of First Baptist Church. We have just formed a committee to plan the celebration to mark that momentous occasion. But if we had missed it, it would be missed for good. We couldn't roll the clock back, and there never will be another 150th anniversary. It's a one-time thing. There is no next time. Which brings me to my point. The great God we serve is patient and loves us so extravagantly that we can hardly comprehend it. But life is so short and fragile, we can't keep thinking that we will plan for eternity "someday." For some people it seems planning for eternity is the last thing on their to do list. Sadly, the longer you put it off, the less likely it is that you will ever come to grips with the Lord in a meaningful way. As long as there is life there is hope, but the Bible tells us that when we hear His voice we should heed His voice, for today is the day of salvation. So that neighbor you've been meaning to invite to church...why not invite them this week? That friend you've needed to apologize to...why not pick up the phone today? That prayer you've been meaning to pray...what's stopping you? There's one last cliche I'll leave you with, one that I think is a really good motto to live by especially concerning spiritual matters... "don't put off till tomorrow what you can do today." Collide Youth News

"I want to see revival in our schools." – a female high school student

"The mission trip really strengthened the bonds I had with my fellow Christians and created new ones for those who I didn't get a chance to know before. God also revealed to me my strengths so I can spread the gospel to others. And it also taught me that everyone, no matter who they may be, can spread he gospel and live for Christ in their own unique ways." - a male high school student

I wish you could hear all of their stories. I wish you could have been a fly on the wall during our time together on the youth mission trip. God is birthing revival in our teenagers, on our youth mission trip we spent hours together one night from 9pm-1:45am, as students confessed sin, revealed deep hurts and brokenness, spoke hard truths into one another's lives and offered words of encouragement. They allowed God to minister through them, prayed together, asked for one another's forgiveness and battled against the spiritual warfare they sensed, proclaiming victory over the devil, in Jesus name.

I know it may sound like I am making some of this up, but I'm not. All of this is 100% true. Something happened on that mission trip, we became a family; we grew in our love for one another. I think we experienced the type of community we read about in Scripture. One student felt alone and without a family and our students gathered around him saying, "we will be your family, we will be here for you to love and support you." They didn't just say it; I've seen them actually do it, post mission trip.

In the wake of the spiritual revival our youth are experiencing I would ask you to come alongside them in prayer. They are going to need the prayers of God's people to fuel them in their faith. The devil is going to try to shut them down. They will be faced with much persecution, be made fun of and ostracized. However, together, and with your prayers they can remain strong.

Ask God what your role might be in coming alongside of these young people. They are ready to reach their school with the gospel. I know this, because they have told me, and many others of how desperately they want to bring the hope of Christ to their peers. If anything, pray for them; believe alongside of them for revival, encourage them to be bold for the sake of gospel. Mentor, challenge and equip them for the battle ahead. Pray for their protection; ask God to provide opportunities for them to share the gospel and pray that students would respond in saving faith. Together, as the body of Christ, we can see revival happen in our community and our youth can lead the way.

September News-Kids Club Ministry

Last month I wrote about a ministry our church has recently adopted called Safe Families. The Safe Family Ministry takes in children temporarily while their parents are in crisis and working to find employment, find stability, get settled, or get healthy. This last month I had the privilege of helping take care of an infant who was placed in another home in our church family but needed some childcare while his Safe Family parents were at work. While I was out and about with him at church or in the community, he attracted attention and I was able to talk to people about Safe Families. I was so encouraged by the love and sense of ownership other families in our church body have for him and other recent placements. Last month I shared this passage from **James 2:14-17**: "What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

Safe Families is a perfect opportunity for our church family to take care of the needs of these children and the families who are opening up their homes to them. Safe Family participants do not receive help from the state and all expenses are from their own resources and hopefully with help from our church body. To learn more about Safe Families go to www.safefamilies.org or ask any of the Safe Families at FBC. So, how can you be part of the Safe Family ministry? 1) While you might not be in a position to be a Safe Family, if you are trained, you could fulfill a much needed role of childcare or respite for a family who has a placement (like I was doing for another family in our church). Please contact Emily Baldwin at 582-6953 for more information if you would like to consider providing occasional childcare or respite for a Safe Family.

2) Our church has a Foster Care/Safe Family closet in the elevator room of our church in the basement. John & Sherry Huffstutler are taking care of the closet now and will be assessing what is needed to assist families with children. You can help by donating diapers (all sizes), pull ups, and Over-Nighters, new or gently used clothing, or other baby/child necessities. Please contact the Sherry at 582-2907 if you have any questions. 3) When you see a family at our church with extra kiddos, ask them about it. Check-in on them and ask them if you can babysit, provide a meal for them, or buy something that the kids need. And lastly, 4) Please pray for our Safe Families, the children they are helping, and their families as they are working to have their family restored. I'm so excited to see how God blesses each of you as you each step out and be the hands and feet of Jesus through Safe Families at First Baptist. See you at Praise in the Park! ~ Mollie





"Our Father Knows"

Recently Jadon and I went fishing but before we went Jadon prayed that God would let him catch a fish. My son had not yet caught a fish in the other two trips we made to the fishing pond. Jadon and I are in the boat together on a normal fishing trip when it all turns to into a great newsletter story!

I had a fish hit my line. I jerked the pole back to set the line like normal; but this little fish only had the tail of my lure in its mouth. So my lure went flying over my head and the little fish shot out of the water and was flying at us. This little fish smacked my son across the face and then landed in his lap. He stood up as it flopped around on the bottom of the boat. Now I'm trying to get my son to sit down and save this little fish all the while trying not to capsize the little boat.

After this quick bit of excitement in the boat, we both had our lines back in the water. I told Jadon that he should have prayed differently. He should have asked that God would let him catch a fish on his pole and not catch one across his face. My son was not finding this funny. He stopped fishing to scold me for laughing but left his lure in the water. Just then his little arm holding the pole went straight out from his body. He screamed "I got one!" He caught the biggest fish of the night and probably of that pond. After releasing the "Biggest Fish Ever" (according to Jadon) we prayed a prayer thanking God for letting us catch this fish.

I'm so thankful that God knows our hearts and knows our needs before we even ask; but I'm also so thankful to know that I can still ask and I don't have to be so detailed as if God will miss something because "Our Father Knows."
