"Back to Basics"

Romans 12:10 says: "Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. "In the month of July my family was blessed to be able to take a couple weeks of vacation, spending half our time in Colorado, and the other half in Michigan. It may not be surprising that we were happy to get home and even cut our time short and came home a day earlier than we initially planned. It's always good to get away and have some time to get refreshed so we are ready to approach ministry with some new insights, and this trip in particular opened my eyes in ways I wasn't expecting. I am excited about our church and the ways that we have grown over the years. During the second week of our vacation, we attended family camp at Life Action Camp in Buchanan, Michigan, and at one point I realized that the other five families that were with us had all been at First Baptist less than five years. We've nearly doubled in size over the last eight years! That's amazing! What's more is that we've grown so much spiritually as well. We have a great mission emphasis, we help each other with meals when people are in need, we have grown closer in fellowship, and expanded our Bible studies almost beyond belief. The kids and youth programs are more active and well attended than ever. I can't even do justice to everything that has grown, improved or been added over the years. My point isn't to brag about how great FBC is, but to remember that there are a few basic Christian fundamentals that we have to come back to over and over. Two of which are simply evangelism and discipleship. In some ways, I'm embarrassed to say, we haven't done these two things as well as we could. Collide Youth News

Chap Clark in his book, "The Adoptive Youth Ministry" says,

"In terms of youth ministry, where for years the young not only have been seen as a separate population but programmatically arranged to maintain and even reinforce that separation, the only way the church can begin to realize its calling to live as a family is by literally adopting the young."

"As a group, this population (youth ministry students) rarely experiences their relationship with the dominant population of the church or society at large as something to which they belong."

The church must "adopt" its young. This is a challenge for all members of First Baptist Church, to invest, relationally, in the lives of our young, by engaging and mentoring families and supporting every teenagers' faith development. Ask God what your role in this is. It could be to serve on the youth ministry team, drive the bus to pick kids up for church or youth group, join the Collide Prayerforce, help at Fall Retreat, lead Sunday school, a Bible study or offer financial support for a student to go to camp or on another youth trip that will invest in their spiritual growth and development.

Clark also says in his book, "In traditional-youth ministry we may use the rhetoric of community to describe our practices, and we believe that what we do actually is an expression of Christian community (although limited to peers and a handful of adults), but generally the best we offer is a shallow and generationally limited approximation of what the New Testament treats as normative." Truth is church, if we want our students faith to stick post graduation, we have to start treating them as the church of today. We have to

look for ways to engage them in the body of Christ, taking their faith to the next level, moving them from spectator to participant, but how do we do this?

My suggestion is through relational engagement. If each person in the church understands their role is to serve as a "youth minister," then our students will understand, first and foremost, they are loved deeply by their church. As the body of Christ gets to know our students, we will have a better idea of where we can plug each one of them in. Truth is, I can't get to know every single student. This is where you, the body of Christ comes in. You play an integral role by engaging our students- taking them to deeper lengths of faith. They need to hear your stories, be challenged by your faithfulness and see the work of God displayed in your life.

Together, as the body of Christ, we have a high calling from God to care for our young. With God's grace, we can accomplish such a feat if we choose to do what might make some of us uncomfortable, but that's the place our faith and our students' faith will grow.

Please do be in prayer and come to me if God places on your Spirit something to do or a way to engage with our youth. Also, please pray for me; pray God would cover me, and the youth ministry team with His grace. Ask God to show me His truth and pray I would be faithful to walk in obedience to it.

August News- Kids Club Ministry Last week my family joined five other families from our church and traveled to Life Action Family Camp outside of Buchanan, Michigan. We had so much fun

on the beach, sharing meals, playing games, and making new friends. We didn't just have fun; however, we were there to meet God. Every morning and evening we had worship and lessons that revolved around this summer's camp theme, "Love One More." As believers we were encouraged that no matter what we're doing already, there is always room to "love one more."

I always silently break out into a mini cold sweat when I think of the word "more" like it has the potential to push me over the edge. I like things planned, orderly, and controlled. I don't like feeling stressed or like there's not enough time in the day to accomplish what I've signed up for. As I was listening, however, I realized that I'm possibly not seeing people around me that I could be "loving" because it's not on my list. Ouch, not a good feeling. As I was listening to the various testimonies of people who have opened up safe houses in rough neighborhoods, adopted several kids, or invited people to live with them, I thought about my dad. When I was growing up my dad did some crazy stuff. He was always inviting strangers into our home and picking up random hitch hikers when we had NO empty seats. One day when I was in high school I came home through the backyard and a hippie couple was hanging laundry in our backyard. My dad had picked them up on the highway and brought them home to shower, do laundry, and pitch their tent in our backyard. I didn't always appreciate these acts of kindness but I see now how my dad was just doing his part in "loving one more" even when he didn't have much to give. Loving others doesn't have to be earth shattering to us but a simple act of kindness could be life giving to others AND it's the true testament of our faith. **James 2:14-17** says, "What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

I'm learning that my to-do list of loving others needs to be stretched. I need to stop over thinking and let the Spirit lead me. I need to be willing to be inconvenienced even if I think I'm already doing enough. That mindset is selfish and not of God. One very practical way that God has placed on my heart (as well as others from our church) is serving as a Safe Family. A Safe Family takes in children for a short period of time if their parents are unable to care for them. This ministry loves one more child at a time by meeting a practical need in a desperate time. Not everyone is called to do this but there are some great ways to come along side these families. Here's just a few but very important ways you can "Love one More" in a practical way through this ministry: 1) Support this ministry by donating diapers, pull ups, and Over-Nighters. You'll be saving these families bundles with this simple act of kindness. 2) Most of the kids who come to their Safe Family don't come with much. Wal-Mart has some super cute clothes at great prices. Hit the clearance rack and donate packs of underwear, t-shirts, shorts/pants, socks, etc. Or if you have children at home, consider donating their gently used clothing and shoes that they no longer use. 3) When you see a family at our church with extra kiddos, ask them about it. Check-in on them and ask them if you can babysit, provide a meal for them, or buy something that the kids need. And lastly, 4) If you go through the training, you can become a respite family, which means you can take the kids for a short time (like a weekend) or during a vacation. There are also several items that we would like to have available for families in the Foster Care closet as well. Will you consider purchasing or donating a gently used item of one of the following: Baby gate, pack n' play, infant car seat, booster seat, or an umbrella stroller? *All items may be placed in the Foster Care Closet located in the elevator room in the basement. Please see Pam for more details.


We have such a loving and giving congregation. I'm so excited to see how God blesses each of you as you each step out and "Love One More." Enjoy the rest of the summer! Mollie

What I mean is that I believe that discipleship will naturally happen as people engage in worship with Christ-centered Biblical preaching, and meet together in small group Bible studies, serve and have a consistent quiet time with the Lord. And I also believe that the outgrowth of that type of discipleship is that people will naturally share their faith, live their faith in full view of others and invite people to church, which is the evangelism part of the equation. I still believe this is the natural way discipleship and evangelism can happen, but I sense that we need to intentionally focus on making sure they are happening. I have two initiatives that I want to get our church involved with. The first is a one on one discipleship ministry. I won't go into all the details at this point, but the idea is that anyone who would like to "be discipled" will sign up and we will pair them up with someone who will walk them through the fundamentals of the Christian faith. My hope and prayer is that we will do this for every new Christian that God brings to FBC until Jesus returns. The second initiative is called Love Thy Neighbor. As Christians we are called by God to love those in need, and I believe if we really can grasp God's call and God's will in loving others, we will be more aware of how we can also love one another as brothers and sisters in Christ. So we will look for ways to identify who our neighbor is, and what it means to love them with Christ's love. You'll be hearing more about this in the weeks and months ahead, but until then, I encourage you to practice Romans 12:10... Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in


