“Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart. Then you will win favor and a good name in the sight of God and man.” ~ Proverbs 3:3-4

Last month I mentioned in a message that God wants to bless us, and we want to be blessed, so there really shouldn't be a problem. The reason we miss the blessing is because we aren't in a position to be blessed. In other words, we aren't blessable. In fact, I would dare to say that most people are desperately seeking to be blessed, asking for it, hoping for it, complaining that they aren't, but unwilling to do what is necessary to be blessed.

The passage from Proverbs states that if we want to find favor with God, we must bind love and faithfulness to us so closely that it's etched on our hearts. I don't think it is too hard to understand what that means. Simply put, treating others like we'd like to be treated (Matthew 7:12), and obeying God to the best of our understanding, without making excuses for our bad behavior puts us in good standing with our Lord. Before I say anything else, I think it's important to clarify the difference between being blessed and being saved. The only thing a person can do to be saved is respond in faith to the grace God offers in Christ. Jesus died to pay for sin, and we accept His payment. As a saved person, we have the potential to be blessed.

What does being blessed look like? I'm going to go out on a limb and suggest that God's favor and blessing have a lot less

to do with the outward life than they do with the inward life. Two things in particular result from God's presence. The first is peace. If I have God's peace, the quality of life goes up infinitely. Think about it this way. If everything in your life is going well, such as finances, job, health, relationships, but you are constantly anxious, fearful, or depressed, you'd be miserable, even though your circumstances are good. On the other hand, if you have God's supernatural peace, even difficult circumstances don't rob you of joy. Peace is a powerful blessing.

The second thing is purpose. The joy and meaning of life is found in a sense of purpose. The idea that what I'm doing has some significance beyond simply surviving. Again, think about it this way. If everything is going reasonably well in your life, but you don't have any hope that it matters, or that nothing you do today matters to another human being on earth, how motivated would you be to continue? Maybe this is personal to me, but I am excited about my life and ministry because I believe that God is using it for His purposes, and it matters.

So, our goal is to offer teaching and community that equip and inspire people to be blessable. We hope that every single worship service will provide the encouragement and tools you need to walk closer with Christ, and find His peace and purpose in your life. All of the ministries are intended to do the same. We hope this newsletter will give you all the information you need to get plugged in and involved. In Christ, Luke

Kids Club Ministry

Last week I had a pretty real conversation with some students in the 4th and 5th grade Sunday School class. I'm going to sidetrack for a moment and say I love Sunday School! It's an hour each week where we have an opportunity to sit around the table with a smaller group of kids and chat about practical matters of being a believer in a way that we can't do at Kids Club or Kids Worship. We look at God's Word and then we talk about how that applies in real life. If your kiddos aren't in Sunday School, I strongly encourage it! We have a dedicated crew of volunteers who teach and pour into each child and it's so worth it!

Well, anyway, the topic last week was baptism and I shared Romans 6:4 with them. *"We were buried with him by baptism into death, in order that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life."* Baptism doesn't save you. It's a heart decision you make with Jesus

that saves you. Once you've made that decision though, the believer is commanded to be baptized to show God and others that they are new! I got out a tub of water and visually illustrated that when a believer goes under the water, it shows people that you believe Jesus died for your sins and that you're dead to your old, sinful way of life. He's cleansed you from the inside out! And when you come up out of the water, you show others that you believe God brought Jesus back to life and that you are living a new life in him. Carefully listen the next time to what the pastor says when he is baptizing someone...this is it!

This is where we got real. I had the kids talk about the difference between their old life and new one. The kids started sharing the sins that were hard to let go of from their "old" lives. Lying and sneaking were big ones. I shared with the kids how I got into a habit of lying when I was about their age because I just thought I could get away with it. There were five kids in my family and it was easy to sneak and hide because my parents were distracted. I told them that once I started doing it I continued to lie out of habit. I just didn't lie about big stuff. I lied about really stupid stuff that I didn't need to lie about. But it was wrong and I knew it. I needed to choose to do the right thing even if I could get away with it. We talked about when we start to lie or sneak (or whatever the sin is), we have to correct ourselves right away. And if we already messed up, we have to confess right away even if it's embarrassing or if we get in trouble. That's the only way to break that old habit. Being righteous and new

in Christ is doing right in God's eyes no matter who's watching or paying attention. If I'm new in Christ, I have to resist my "old" way of doing things and the only way to do this is getting connected with God daily through his Word, talking to him, and surrounding myself with a Body of Believers who desire the new way of life, too.

Parents, I encourage you to take time and really talk to your kids about the habits they have that are not God-honoring. And help set them up for success. Don't ignore that white lie. Don't let that sneakiness go unaddressed. Don't let rude or disrespectful behavior continue. This is the time to be having real, honest, transparent conversations with your kids about living in God-honoring ways. Give them practical ways to break their habits and make sure you point out where you struggle so they know they're not alone in it! Kids want real. They want to see we struggle, too! And you as the parent, have the opportunity to have the greatest impact in their faith walk.

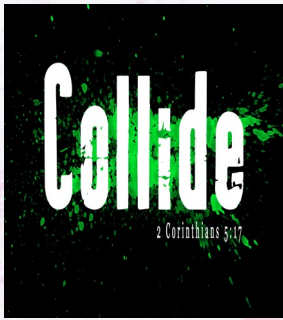

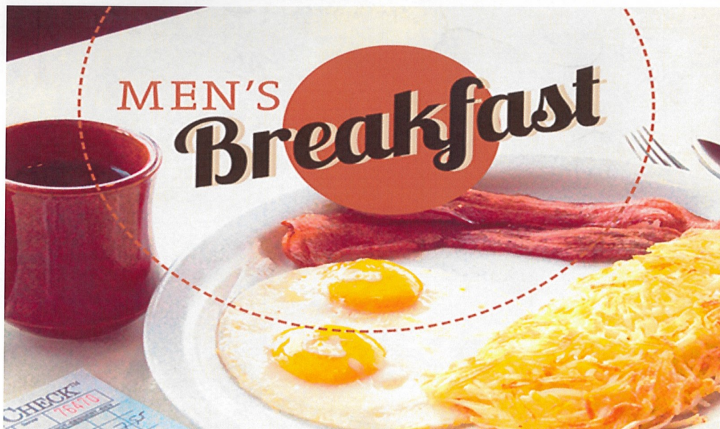

Continuous Reminder to Yield

As all the crew members begin to report to the deck because the all hands-on deck signal has been sounded by Luke. Please keep in mind the work as worship or service to God and not for any other purpose. I've often fallen into that trap and then get frustrated when not thanked or noticed. I cannot serve God based on recognition because then I become proud about what I have then accomplished. I'm constantly reminded of John 15 the vine and the branch and verse 5b says that "... for apart from me you can do nothing."



God will usually send me a reminder when I'm stuck in serving in my own strength. Usually it's a situation in which I'm so desperate for Him to help me that it leads me in deeper prayer, the vine and crying out for help. Oh, to be reminded daily how desperate I'm for God to lead my life and direct my day. My devotions and areas of ministry keep reminding me of this point "Beware of any work for God that causes or allows you to avoid concentrating on Him. A great number of Christian workers worship their work. The only concern of Christian workers should be their concentration on God." (Utmost for His Highest). My focus and concentration is on God and not on the work. A freedom will overtake you when you're entirely yielded to God. The work, a ministry or doing anything becomes a way to show God how you love Him. -Seth

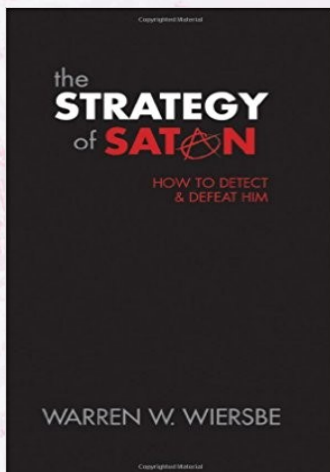

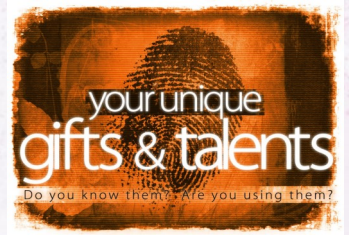

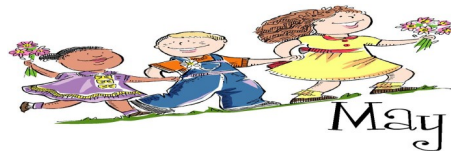
Uniquely Gifted Workshop-New Addition May 9th at 6:30pm- Led by Luke Dunn
