When it comes to our desire and willingness to follow Christ, we often find ourselves unable to do what we think God requires. Perfection is God's requirement, and absolute obedience is His standard. No one alive measures up. Thankfully, Christ met the standard on our behalf. But

we are still called to grow, mature, and obey. Sadly, many people feel overwhelmed and alone, thinking that they still can't do what God is asking. But, just like the disciples, we aren't alone. We can help each other. If we desire a closer relationship with Christ, we can have it. If we desire to overcome temptation, we can. The Word of God tells us clearly that "if you draw near to God, He will draw near to you." ~ James 4:8. "And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it." ~ 1 Corinthians 10:13. Sometimes it will require more discipline. Often times, it requires a simple act of humility to admit weakness and ask for help. Wherever you are in your spiritual journey, I encourage you to have a willing spirit. Willing to seek. Willing to grow. Willing to learn. Willing to obey. Willing to admit fault and failure. Willing to ask for help. And, Lord willing, even with weak flesh, we can do everything God made us for.

Kids Club is well on its way and we've had record numbers already! It's been on my heart for a long time that we should be reaching at least 100 kids weekly at Kids Club and I'm super excited to see it grow! We had 87 kids on the first night and I told the kids that if we hit

100 at least once before our Glow Party on October 24<sup>th</sup>, they get to slime me! You can't see my face right now but YUCK! I don't like to get wet or gross but it'll totally be worth it! (LOL) My ultimate goal

is that we see young people make decisions for Jesus and that their lives change because of it. Please join me in prayer for our young people and their families; that they are presented with the Gospel, that they believe it, and that they make the decision to follow Jesus.

We're also giving the kids two key memory verses that they're learning

all session. On the last night they'll recite those verses and take the points they earn to the prize table. Extra copies can be found at Kids Corner in the foyer. The kids are encouraged to bring non-perishable food items for the food pantries to reach a goal of 800

points by the last night (Nov. 14<sup>th</sup>) for a party! The kids always go way past their goal and they help a lot of families in the process. Thanks, parents, for helping us!
