"...when the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on the earth?" ~ Luke 18:8

When Jesus returns will He find faith on the earth? He Himself asked that question. It came at the tail end of a parable concerning prayer. The parable was about a widow who relentlessly went to a judge to get justice, and the moral of the story was that she got justice because of her persistence, and that we should never give up in prayer because God is far more kind, gracious and just than any earthly judge. The parable is meant to motivate followers of Christ to have faith. In a sense, that's the sum of what the church exists to do. We are encouraging believers to continue to have faith, and non-believers to begin to have faith.

When faith is removed, fear creeps in. People become overwhelmed with all the possibilities that are outside their control. This is where worry, anxiety, fear, depression, and despair begin to form in a person's mind. It's such a perpetual cycle that it leaves many people feeling hopeless. The way out is ironic. To combat fear, we must fear the right thing, or rather the right Person. The Bible tells us to fear not 365 times. It also tells us that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of both wisdom and knowledge. A.W. Tozer said that if a man fears God, he need not fear anyone

else. The point should be obvious. When we care most about what God thinks, pleasing God, honoring Him, and doing His will, before too long our fear of the future, other people, failure, or some other uncontrollable outcome fades away. This is a lifelong daily battle. We need to intentionally turn our thoughts and hearts toward God in prayer. This isn't a fatalistic exercise. It's not throwing our hands in the air and saying, "oh well, God will take care of it." We pray and read God's Word to best understand His will, and actively do His will. Fearing God, and putting our complete trust in Him means I believe His will is best, and He will guide me in doing what He desires. When Christians do that, not only do we grow in faith, but we inspire those around us to do the same.

Faith verses Fear is the theme of the message for Praise in the Park this year. We are going to look at how a little boy named David could trust God so much that he had no fear of the terrible giant Goliath. I'm excited for all that God is going to do at Praise in the Park, and I pray that you'll come, bring a friend, and be encouraged!

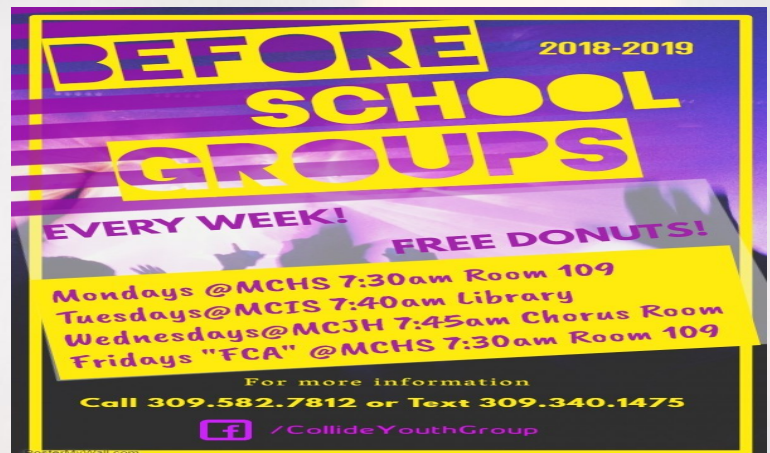

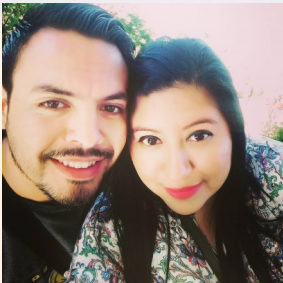

I arrived in Aledo Saturday night and I stayed my first night with a precious family the Maynards. Sunday morning I had my first visit at the church. I talked about the purpose that God has for each of us. Then I participated in the Children's Ministry. I introduced myself and shared about my country and why I came to America.

In the afternoon, I met with Pastor Seth and we went to visit a Mexican family. The purpose was to go and share the Gospel. God answered our prayer because one of the members of that family received Jesus as his Lord and Savior. His name is Victor, I ask you to pray for him.

Tuesday, I had fellowship with the Rickes. I had a great conversation with Pam and Kevin. Kevin and I talked about missions and how we conceive that term in our mind. I learned that Missions are the way you minister to people, how you have fellowship, not necessarily to hold a tool and work physically. Wednesday, I had free morning, I decided to have a time to pray and get ready for my participation in the Youth Meeting. Praise the Lord that was a great time! God was with me leading me to say what He wanted me to say. I met Mario.

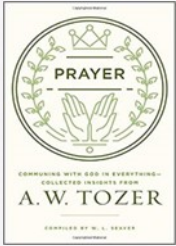
