"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." ~ 1 Thessalonians 5:18

We are told in Scripture to be thankful in all circumstances. This is a hard teaching, yet amazingly powerful November is the when applied. month designated for thanksgiving. The reason is self-evident. Even though most of us aren't farmers, we understand the need to celebrate the harvest, thanking God for His gracious provision. Legend has it that did this the Puritans after a devastating year. They lost half their population the preceding winter, and their experienced first spring. summer, and fall on American soil. By God's grace the local natives had mercy on them and showed them how to survive, planting corn, extracting Maple syrup, and avoiding deadly plants. The result was a harvest and the first Thanksgiving celebration. While food was consumed (probably more lobster than turkey!) the point was to praise and thank God for His wonderful grace and mercy. President Lincoln established the Thanksgiving holiday in the midst of the Civil War, while thousands were still dying in the bloodiest war we've ever known. It is hard to imagine giving thanks in that circumstance, yet how important it

was to do so. We are tempted to only give thanks when things are going well. Many find it difficult to give thanks when life is hard. Understandably so. Yet, if we will believe God's Word, trust His will, and give Him praise and thanksgiving no matter what circumstance we are living through, we find at least three things happen. The first thing that happens is that our faith grows. We believe and trust God more because we exercise our faith in those difficult times. The second thing that happens is our attitude changes. We begin to have hope. We prime the pump for more thankfulness, and begin to count our blessings. The third thing that happens is that we show those around us what it looks like to be a Christian. There is no more powerful witness to a watching world than for Christians to give thanks in ALL circumstances. So, in honor of the puritans giving thanks after the hardest year of their lives, I am promoting a puritan classic as our book of the month. John Newton (Writer of the hymn "Amazing Grace") said if he might read only one book beside the Bible, he would choose The Christian in Complete Armour by William Gurnall. I hope it blesses you this month.


Kids Sunday School Christmas Parties




J.O.Y. Circle Christmas Party- All ladies are invited to J.O.Y.
