"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." ~ Matthew 5:14-16

Recently, I was in the car with my girls late in the afternoon, and one of them asked why the horizon gets so colorful when the sun goes down. I am not an expert on such things, but I do know that it has to do with how light travels through our atmosphere, and because it is coming in at an angle, it stretches, which shows more colors, a little bit like a rainbow. At that point, we started talking about rainbows we had seen. It is amazing to think about the science of light and colors and vision, and how easy it is to take it for granted. One article I read said this:

"To put it simply, light is a type of radiant energy that we are able to visually perceive with our eyes. In other words, light is power that we can see! Visible light is a small part of a large part of what is called the Electromagnetic Spectrum, which contains all of the energy types that travel through space in a wave-like manor. Every day, light waves reflect off of objects and into our eyes, which allows us to see the objects."

That might not be profound scientific insight, but it is interesting. Light is

energy that we see. It is exactly what Jesus said in Matthew 5 about His followers. We would be energy (good works), that people would see and give glory to the Father. We would have different intensities. He gives the example of a city, and a lamp. Those would be very different amounts of light. I don't think I'd be stretching too far to say that the differences between all of Christ's followers is as vastly different and wonderfully variated as all the different kinds of light between a single candle, and the output of an entire city.

This Easter season, we are focusing like a laser (pun intended), on the theme of "Be the Light." I would like to say it as simply as Jesus did: "You are the light of the world." Let your light shine. Your light is how you uniquely reflect the power of Christ in and through your life. Two things to consider: 1) Is there anything in your life that would hide or deflect the light of Christ? This might be fear, unresolved conflict, unwillingness to obey the Lord in some way, or outright sin. And 2) Light is positive, beautiful, and necessary. Who do you want and/or need to be a light to? Jesus said that the result would be that people would glorify the Father. This Easter, we are praying that the light of Christ would so shine through His people that it would virtually extinguish the darkness in Mercer County.
