The week before Memorial Day I was in Washington D.C. with my family. I was there for a conference sponsored by the Family Research Council, and took the opportunity to have my family with me so they could do some sightseeing. One of the sessions I attended during the conference was a panel discussion titled: “Manhood, Family, and the Church.” One of the panelists was the director of the Marriage and Religion Research Institute. You can find tons of research data at www.MARRI.us. All the data and research points to a shockingly simple conclusion. Always together, never divorced marriages are statistically most likely to do best in every category, whether that is financial, health, satisfaction, stability, community involvement or anything else. They are also most likely to be consistently plugged into a local church. This has been found to be true not only in the U.S., but in any society that they've studied. I have just boiled down thousands of pages of data into a couple sentences. The thing that I want to point out here is that God's Word is true, and no matter how you study cultural issues, it will always point back to what God clearly told us in the Bible. Godliness has value for all things. It's a reciprocal relationship. The more a family seeks the Lord (and attends church), the more stable that family will be. The more stable the family unit is, the more of a blessing that family is to the culture. God's standard of

marriage and family is His gift to the world. And God's gift to the family is the local church, which consistently teaches God's Word and motivates people to live according to God's will. If I can digress for a moment, I would say that somewhere along the way the church may have lost sight of this. It's possible we began to see ourselves as weekly revival services, where we desire to make converts, and missed our calling to make disciples. Obviously, we need to do both, but there seems to be an underlying idea that what people need is a bolt of lightning transformative experience (every week), rather than a progressive transformational experience over a lifetime. So, I began thinking about our church. I think God has blessed our church. Not only with conversions, but with disciples, and with growth, vibrancy, excitement, health, life, good programs, godly leaders, Biblical teaching, and so much more. I believe anyone who would attend our church consistently would be better off. There should be no embarrassment in encouraging people to attend more frequently, or in inviting others to come. In fact, I am certain that it would greatly benefit us all. The church doesn't take the place of a relationship with God, but it teaches people how to have one, and encourages them to do so, equipping them with truth and people who can guide them into those truths, help with struggles, and empowering their gifts. The church is the unique body of Christ that God gave to the world to bless it. So, come to church, invite a friend, and enjoy God's goodness.

Roar! Vacation Bible School

All kids ages 3 years old-5th grade graduates are invited to join us at First Baptist Church, Aledo, IL for Roar VBS the week of **June 24th-28th from 9am-Noon** where kids will learn that "Life is wild but God is Good."



This is a free week of programming that includes amazing music, cool activities, fun games, yummy snacks, & awesome Bible lessons. Kids are encouraged to come every day but are welcome to come as their schedules allow. Register anytime at www.firstbaptistaledo.com or contact the church office at 582-7812.

Sign-in is from 8:35-9:00am each morning through the front entrance. Parents are asked to sign-in with their children each morning so that they can receive a pick-up tag. *Please let us know at check-in if somebody else will be picking up your child. For pick-up, parents must present their tag at the door to get access into the sanctuary to wait for dismissal. The sanctuary opens for parents at 11:45am. Please sit in the back of the sanctuary until kids are dismissed at noon. At that time, parents may come to the crews to get their children.

T-shirts: ROAR VBS t-shirts are available to pre-order at \$6 when you register by June 5th. We will order extras for the week of VBS but sizes and quantities will be limited. *Pre-ordered shirts may be picked up by June 23rd or during VBS week.

Mission Project: This year kids will be

raising money for FBC's School Supply Shop at the Keithsburg Food Pantry in July. Our goal is to raise \$800 to buy supplies for families in need in Mercer County. If kids reach their goal by Friday, they'll celebrate with ice-cream and will get to SPLAT Mollie & other volunteers. *Kids need to bring their money into the sanctuary (checks or cash) and put in the buckets up front each morning. (Checks may be payable to "FBC" with "VBS MISSION PROJECT" in memo.

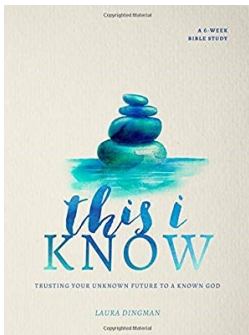

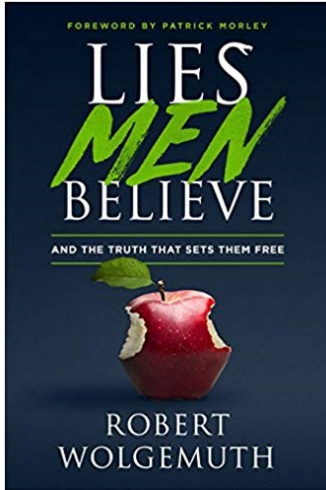
Buchanan, MI at Life Action Camp
