A delicate balance. I was teaching some of the men at one eighty, and as I was making the plea for the men to put their hope in Christ, someone asked if I could teach a lesson on how we can know Christianity is true, as opposed to other religions. I said absolutely, I would love That's the study of apologetics. to. Apologetics is the study of the reasonableness of the claims of Christianity. It literally means "to make a defense." Is what we believe a blind leap of faith, or is it reasonable and supported by tons of evidence? Well, it's a delicate balance. There is so much evidence that supports the claims of Christianity that one could easily contend that it takes more "faith" to believe in evolution than creation. In simple terms, think about this: the existence of anything, absolutely anything at all, requires that something (more accurately Someone) must exist eternally. Ponder that for a moment. Nothing can come from nothing. So. either the universe, or matter must be eternal, which we know it's not, or there is an eternal being that exists who created all that is. The next step from there is to prove or give evidence that the One who exists eternally (God), is the God revealed in the Bible. The delicate balance is this: not only do people need to know that

what we believe is reasonable, this is the issue of absolute truth, but people also need to know that it makes a difference in This is the anecdotal or their lives. subjective truth we call our testimony. Often times testimonies have more power, certainly more emotion, than objective, absolute truth. The delicate balance for us is that we highlight our testimonies, but always return to the foundation of God's Word, which is the absolute truth. Faith is required. It's a delicate balance. This month we are hosting Rick McGough from Local Church Apologetics, who is going to do three things:

- Co-teach a Wednesday Night Live Class with me called "Defending Your Faith" – limited to 45 sign ups.
- Preach on Sunday morning at both services on September 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Lead a one night event called "Can You Trust the Bible?" on September 15<sup>th</sup> from 6-8pm with worship and a testimony by Rusty Boruff.

I hope you will be blessed by one of these opportunities in September. Most importantly I hope that you'll learn the delicate balance of the confidence of absolute truth, and the life-altering experience of knowing Christ personally.






our walk with Jesus. It is in building our foundation on the rock of Christ that we grow together as the body of Christ. Then in turn we can serve others through our abundance.




### The Refuge Student Ministry


FBCA Student Ministry is updating our name to "The Refuge" with Psalm 18:2 as our scripture. This change
