Over the past few months I have enjoyed preaching through the Life of Christ. We are quickly approaching Easter, which means that this series is coming to its glorious conclusion... the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus, which, as Paul states in 1 Corinthians, is the gospel that saves us. It is always the first and foremost concern and desire that people know this good news and are invited and challenged to respond to it by simple faith. We also seek to encourage and challenge believers to continue to respond in faith. Sometimes this means growing in discipleship, and sometimes we emphasize practical obedience through repentance or service.

This Easter we plan to focus on recommitment to Christ. Many, many people have made a profession of faith to Jesus in the past. Likewise, many people have fallen short of that commitment in one way or another. Sometimes what we need is an opportunity to start again. In the technology world, a program or device can get stuck. What needs to happen is a reboot to get it working again. Life can be like that sometimes. When people get stuck in bad patterns of living or thinking they need to reset the system of their life. Rather than focusing on the problem, and living with a sense of frustration, we need to let Jesus take over. A recommitment to Christ isn't the same as getting saved. It recognizes a past history with God, and it admits to being derailed, and affirms the desire to renew an otherwise neglected relationship with the Lord. As we move into spring, my hope is that there will be a sense of new life and hope in people's relationship with Christ every bit as evident as the temperature, grass and flowers. You don't have to wait till Easter to recommit your life to Christ, nor do you have to wait till Easter to invite friends and family to church, but it sure is a great time to do both.





Land & Building/Missions

Land and Building



This year is flying by already. The first few weeks of 2022 were a whirlwind of activity as we responded to the opportunity to bid on the land across the street from the church. By God's grace we were able to purchase 38 acres. For the past few months we've been discussing what to do next. We intend to sell a majority portion of the land, and keep some acreage for parking and future developments. On the table is the decision to sell 23 acres and keep 15, or to sell 28 acres and keep 10. There are a few factors that influence that decision.

- 1) Zoning Anything over 15 acres remains agricultural which means lower taxes and less red tape for development.
- 2) Cost The more land we keep, the more it costs. The difference in cost between 10 acres and 15 is \$63,000.
- 3) Need The big question is how much land do we think we will need both now and in the future. Right now, we simply need an acre or two to develop into a parking lot. It is impossible to know how much land the church may need in the future, but 10 acres would seem sufficient.
- 4) Use How much of the land will we use in the short-term. As stated above, it is likely we will only use an acre or two. The question has been asked, do we plan to build on the new land. The answer is not right now. The building committee is working on plans for expansion and all options are being considered, but the best options still seem to keep our future building expansion connected to our current building.

Pray for our Church Council and Building Committee as we continue to seek the Lord on His will for the future of First Baptist. At the April business meeting, we will be voting on the sale of the land. That will be the only official decision we will be voting on in regards to the land, parking or building developments. In the near future we will be presenting more information regarding building and parking. Thank you for your prayers and your patience as we work on these issues.

Another Mission



Two years ago Mollie and I were supposed to go on a mission trip to Athens, Greece with a team from Exposed to Christ Ministries. We had been preparing for that trip for about a year, but then everything was shut down due to covid. The trip was rescheduled for the spring of 2021, but when the time rolled around the restrictions were still preventing international travel. postponed another year, tentatively hoping that by the spring of 2022 we would be cleared for takeoff. By all accounts, it looks like we will be able to finally go on this mission trip that we've been planning for three years. We will leave on April 27th, and be doing the lion's share of the mission work in Athens among refugees. We will also be traveling north and visiting some of the ancient cities we read about in the book of Acts where the Apostle Paul planted the first churches. At the end of the trip Mollie and I will take a short plane ride over to Rome where we hope to spend a couple days seeing some more historic and biblical sites.

It was my hope that such a trip might expand our mission opportunities for FBC. While we would continue to partner with Rigo in El Salvador, we might also do mission work in other parts of the world. We've been blessed to develop a wonderful connection with the people in El Salvador, and over the years our church has done mission work in Nicaragua, Bolivia, Ukraine, as well as Los Angeles, Cornerstone, Kentucky, Joplin, Missouri, Oklahoma, and South Dakota. It may be that the Lord has other opportunities for us to serve that we haven't discovered yet. Pray for us as we travel and serve in a new region of the world, and we will be excited to share what God shows us.
