

Buildings, and Space, and Vision and all that Stuff

"Lord, where would we go? You have the words of eternal life." – Apostle Peter (paraphrase)

Where are we going? Jesus had told His disciples that following Him required some very demanding commitments and a leap of faith. He said they had to eat His flesh and drink His blood. Obviously, that was a disturbing image for them to wrap their minds around. He later said His words were Spirit and they were Life. He didn't mean to imply cannibalism, but rather life and eternal life was inseparable from receiving Him as Lord and Savior. This is the nature of the Gospel. It is Good News, but it is exclusively found only in Christ. I am convinced that our church has been blessed and continues to thrive because we have been unafraid to be unwavering in sharing the Gospel. That doesn't mean we don't need to invest in kid's ministry or youth ministry or missions or serving our community or discipleship or all the other things we do in ministry. All those things are the method of communicating the message. But if we do all those things, and lose sight of the transforming power of God's Word, they simply wouldn't be effective. So, what do we do?

Our building committee is working hard to discern and craft a proposal that will enable FBC to continue to grow for many, many years. I mentioned last month that there was a consensus that the new building should be built on the 10 acres we acquired by a clear miracle of God. That proposal will be presented soon. It is no secret that it includes a sanctuary and a kids area as the first phase.

In the mean-time, we can't wait another year or two for a building. In order to continue to grow we need to do something different on Sunday mornings. There are many options. I have suggested a couple that could be considered. One was to offer a third service. As we've talked about this option, it usually finds resistance because of how much more pressure it would put on all the staff and volunteers. Another option that has potential is to adjust our Sunday morning schedule. One of the hindrances to our growth is that most young families won't come to the early service because a) it's too early, and b) there is no kids programming at 8am. It is being suggested that we move 8am service to 9am and move 10:15am to 10:30am.

The schedule would be: 9am worship and Sunday School, 10:30am worship. We would also offer a couple adult studies at 8am. There are some details we need to work on, but the hope is that there would be a greater potential for the services to be more evenly distributed, which gives room for both to grow. This is a significant change to our church life. In the 16+ years I've been the pastor we have never made a significant change to our Sunday morning schedule. Part of the reason is that 1) having two services gives us the ability to reach more people and 2) we believe Sunday school is still an effective program. What is clear to me is that there are many more people we need to reach in our community. It is increasingly clear that our church has to think more about what sacrifices we might need to make to reach our community. In the end, I am convinced that the fields are ripe for harvest, but we need to make room for it.




Refuge Student Ministry





Join us for J.O.Y. Circle!
