

"There is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God." ~ Romans 13:1

In Romans, Paul wrote by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, that no authority competes with God. He is in This was true even when the Roman government had decided that Christianity was illegal and those that openly practiced faith in Jesus could be beaten, imprisoned or thrown to wild animals for a spectator sport in the colosseum. Christians still knew and believed God was in charge, even if the government was out to get them. Paul probably had an Old Testament story in mind when he wrote that. Nebuchadnezzar had been the most powerful king in the world and even conquered God's people and took them into exile around 600 B.C. Yet he learned that his power was given to him by God, and the moment he took credit for himself, God humbled him until he acknowledged God's right to rule (read Daniel chapter 4).

In the past few weeks we've been led by God to focus on prayer. I had a different sermon series in mind for this season, just read last month's newsletter article... Thankfully, God knows best and He's good enough to get us on His page if we will just trust Him. A lot of people are anxious about the election. The Bible tells us what to do when we are anxious. Philippians clearly tells us to trade our anxiety in for prayer and the peace of Christ will protect us. Peter says to cast our anxiety on Christ because He cares for us. It doesn't mean we opt out of caring, voting or being involved, but instead that we pray for God's will and His direction for ourselves and our nation. Even if our nation seems to be in a mess, I'm grateful for the freedom we still enjoy and all that we've been blessed with. More than that, I'm thankful to be a citizen of heaven. We know God is in charge of our eternity, and it's good to know He's still in charge of our day to day.
















### **Refuge Student Ministry News**


