

Pastor's Perspective

"Walk by the spirit..." Galatians 5:16

Another new year is here. It's hard to believe we are now a quarter of a century into the new millennium. Every time a new year rolls around we are challenged to consider making changes or renewing commitments. It's a good time for a restart. We think about starting some good habits and kicking some bad ones. Habits are powerful things. Anything you do on a daily basis is going to have an impact on your life. Studies have shown that walking 30 minutes a day five days a week will significantly improve a person's health. The Bible clearly teaches that we ought to walk by the Spirit. If our lives can be improved by increasing our physical fitness, just imagine how our lives can improve by growing closer to God. No matter what you do your body will inevitably wear out, but your soul never will. There is a limit to how strong or healthy your body can be, but there is no limit to how much you can grow spiritually. Not only that, but as you grow more spiritually active, you gain more and more control over the weaknesses of the flesh (in this case we mean sinful tendencies, not physical abilities..). Paul wrote to Timothy that physical training was useful for somethings, but godliness was useful for everything, n the new year we are going to begin by focusing what it means to walk in the Spirit, and how to do so. As we approach a new year and think about new habits to start, let me encourage you to make a few commitments:

1)Read the Bible at least 10 minutes 5 days a week.

2)Spend 20 minutes in prayer at least 5 days a week.

3)Commit to going to church each week unless sick or traveling.

4)Begin attending a Bible study (Sunday School Classes are an easy option).

5)Invite one person to join you for church (and don't give up until someone actually shows up).

Here is what can happen:

-10 minutes of Bible reading a day will result in reading the whole Bible in under two years.

-Daily prayer has proven to reduce stress, decrease chronic illness, and improve mental health, not to mention staying close to God, gaining wisdom and discernment, and unleashing the power of heaven in your life.

-Regular church attendance has proven to improve our quality of life, give purpose to life, connect people socially, and reduce stress and depression. Not to mention it glorifies God and builds His kingdom.

-Regular Bible study will expand and activate the Bible reading you are doing.

-If everyone invited one person to church each year, the church would double in size every year (if everyone invited stayed...). Reaching our community is more about you inviting your friends, family and neighbors than it is about our programs...

Walking in the Spirit is not a new thing, and it's not novel. But we can grow in it and I'm looking forward to our journey as we start this marathon together.

A Letter from the FBC Capital Campaign Committee

Dear Church Family,

We are so thankful to be used by our mighty God to see so many lives changed in Mercer County. Our vision is to reach every heart for Christ in Mercer County and beyond, and that vision includes making room for many more people. The first big step was securing the land across the street that would enable us to expand. The next big step was to reimagine what the future for FBC might look like on a 13-acre campus. The third step has been to develop a building strategy that could meet our most immediate needs for growth. We continue to work together to discern God's will and plan for our church. The building committee hosted a town hall meeting in November to further the discussion on the vision and how to proceed.

From that meeting the building committee received direction on what the church body would like to see with regards to some changes to the proposed building plan. It was agreed that the proposed building plan was a little too ambitious, and a new building plan would be scaled back and resemble the 2020 proposal to some degree.


The 2020 proposal included a gym which would also function as a fellowship hall, and a kitchen, as well as a kid's ministry area that was secure. The building committee has been working on some ideas to meet these needs and will be discussing them at another town hall meeting on January 12th.

Earlier this year we began the process of raising funds for the project by launching a capital campaign. We are very grateful to all those that made generous commitments to help bring this vision into reality. We also know that many people have not yet made a decision concerning the capital campaign, and we would like to encourage you to pray about investing in the vision of FBC. Some people have already begun to fulfill their commitments, while others are waiting for clear direction before they begin to give to the capital campaign. We would like to suggest that gifts to the building fund can be given, if you are comfortable, at any time. If you prefer to wait, we suggest that you begin fulfilling your commitment once the church has voted on a building plan. In the meantime, year-end gifts of any size are appreciated. Please mark "Building Fund" in the memo of the check or envelope. We are excited to see how God is going to move in the upcoming months as we continue to reach every heart for Christ in Mercer County and beyond. Thank you for being such an important part of the ministry of FBC. Together, with God's help, we are making a difference.
