Well, this will be my final newsletter for FBC. If my math is right, it will be nearly 300 articles I have written in the 18 years that I've been here. Some of doing the math and think you are overestimating, but you may not remember that for several years we published 2 newsletters a month. When I was called to FBC George W. Bush was president. It's interesting to think that our country has had 5 presidents, but the church has had only one senior pastor in that amount of time. Even more interesting to think that FBC has only had three pastors in the past 60 years! God has been good to FBC and God has been good to us. We've been blessed here. We've seen a lot of changes, God has been mightily at work, and many people have been impacted by the ministry we were able to do together. Mollie and I have often talked about how strange it is to see kids attending Kid's Club whose mom or dad was once a kid who attended Kid's Club. We were blessed to be able to serve the Lord together under one roof.

We learned a lot. Every lesson I learned from success and failure I hope to take with me into our new calling. FBC took a chance on me 18 years ago. I was just 30 years old and had only led a small church of little more than 50 people for a few years when FBC called me. When we moved to Aledo we had a car breakdown on the way, and when we got to Aledo we were hit by an ice storm that knocked out the power for 3 days. People joked that it was a bad omen, but I was never worried. I knew God called us to Aledo and I knew He had good things in store for us. We went through some hard things along the way, but God always brought us through. We're more seasoned now, but still just as excited to see what God can do. We are praying for FBC and the amazing things God will do in your next season. Pray for us too. I hope and pray our next season in ministry will be even more fruitful than our last. Thank you for so many good years. We will miss you all.


24 Hour Prayer Vigil

Rhubarb Fest!

Hey church family, we will be selling pie by the slice at this year's Aledo Rhubarb Fest on Friday, June 6th to help fund two approaching activities for our youth and young adults. We have a few high schoolers that will be leaving for a Mission trip June 13th-20th, 2025 in Ohio, and we have a small group of young adults that will be attending a conference in January 2026. We are asking for your help in a variety of ways:



Rhubarb growers - If you have been blessed with a rhubarb crop this year and would like to share, we are asking for at least 35 – 1 gallon size bags filled with cut (1" pieces) and washed rhubarb. Please bring the fresh (not frozen) Rhubarb to the church between May 29th-June 1st, and place it in the basement refrigerator. If you have the rhubarb and would like someone else to harvest it for you, then just let us know!

Seasoned Rhubarb Pie Makers – We are looking for 3 seasoned rhubarb pie makers to impart their wisdom of rhubarb pie making to some of our youth on Wednesday, June 4th, and possibly Thursday, June 5th. We will be using premade Amish crusts this year but need your skills to teach us how to make and assemble these pies. Those with an Oven – We are looking for volunteers within our church to pick up pies throughout the day on Wednesday June 4th, and possibly Thursday, June 5th to bake them. It will take about an hour to an hour and half for two pies. Free smells are included!

Packaging Partners – We would love to have a few volunteers on Thursday, June 5th to help with cutting and packaging the pie slices. Laughter and wonderful conversation will be included.

Everyone – Please lift all our high schoolers and young adults in prayer. We are praying that each group will continue to seek God and His will for their lives, to be encouraged and strengthened in their walks, and to be filled with His light and wisdom so they can continue to point others to Christ.
